# German Heraldry



- Personal & Family Arms
- Private Registrations
- No System of Cadency
- Heraldic Privilege
- Fine Workmanship
- One Month Lead Time
- Fees usually under \$500
- Most Registrations require German connection



# South African Heraldry



- Personal & Family Arms
- Public Registration
- English Cadency
- No Heraldic Privilege
- Mediocre Workmanship
- Six Month Lead Time
- Approximately \$560 fee
- No connection required



# English Heraldry



- Personal Arms
- Public Grants & Registrations
- English Cadency
- Heraldic Privilege
- Fine Workmanship
- Six Month Lead Time
- Fees of \$8,750
- Must have British connection



# Scottish Heraldry



- Personal Arms
- Public Grants & Registrations
- Scottish Cadency
- Heraldic Privilege
- Fine Workmanship
- Six Month Lead Time
- Fees of \$3,400 plus
- “Rematriculation” requirement



# Irish Heraldry



- Personal Arms
- Public Grants & Registrations
- English & Scottish Cadency
- Heraldic Privilege
- Fine Workmanship
- Three Month Lead Time
- Fees of \$5,000
- Must have Irish connection



# Spanish Heraldry



- Personal Arms
- Public Grants & Registrations
- Ad Hoc System of Cadency
- Heraldic Privilege
- Fine Workmanship
- 1 - 3 Month Lead Time
- € 300 for New Certification
- € 1,500 for New Design
- Ancient User Privilege \*news

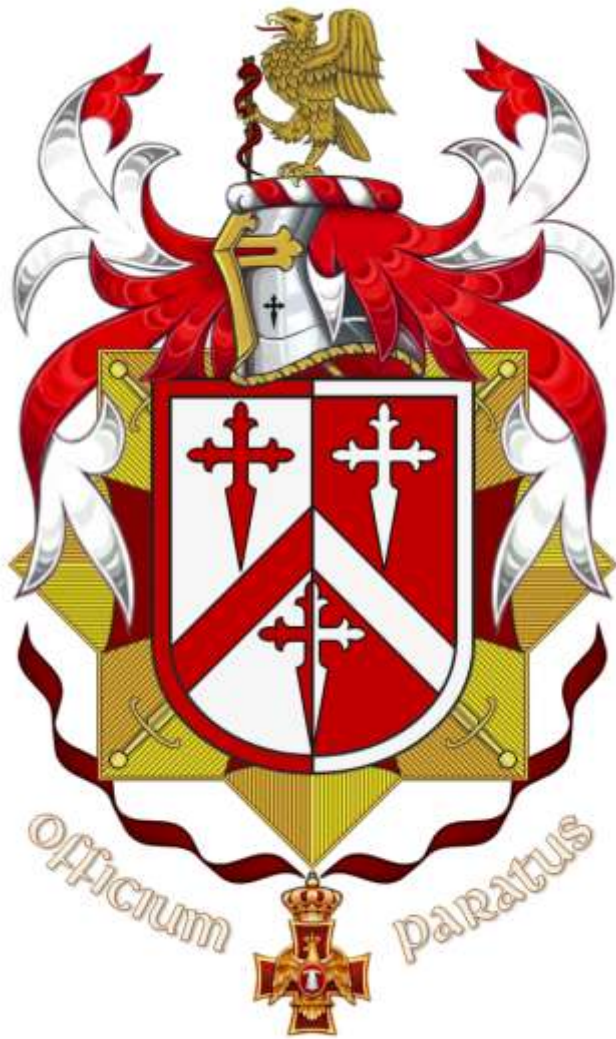
